## Unclaimed Property Authority

**John Anthony Gabriel, Jr.** graduated from the University of North Alabama and received a Bachelor of Science Degree with a double major in both accounting and finance. John started his career with the State of Tennessee as Legislative Auditor with the Comptroller of the Treasury. He then came to the Treasury Department as the Operations Manager in the Unclaimed Property Division for seven years. In 2005, John was promoted to the Director of Unclaimed Property Division.

John speaks to various groups and conferences continually increasing awareness of unclaimed property reporting requirements. In addition to speaking engagements, John's responsibilities include planning, budgeting, and oversight of the daily operations of the Tennessee Treasury Unclaimed Property Program. John was President of the National Association of Unclaimed Property Administrators (NAUPA) in 2010 and received the Presidential Distinguished Service Award in 2016. He is a member of the NAUPA Executive Committee and currently serves as Chairman of the Uniformity and Standardization Committee. John is married and has three daughters.

**Randy Stroede** joined Conduent in 2003 and works in St. Louis, Missouri. Randy directs the various functions within the State Systems group that directly support the UPS2000 clients. This includes implementations, conversions, training, and managing client system issues and requests. Randy has implemented document imaging systems in 6 states. Two of those imaging implementations included a backfile conversion (scanning of old paper or microfilmed documented) and one included conversion of images from a prior document imaging system. He has worked with the clients to implement a completely paperless claims workflow process.

Prior to joining Conduent, he was a consultant for the State of Illinois Treasurer's Office, as a Project Manager for the implementation of the UPS2000 system and an imaging system for that state agency. He managed the process of a conversion from 3 in-house mainframe state systems into UPS2000. Additionally, he identified functionality gaps, and helped design and manage the implementation of features in UPS2000 to address the identified gaps, many of those features contributed to the rich feature set that UPS2000 clients use today.

Randy has over 25 years of Information Technology experience, with many of those years as an IT consultant, with a primary focus on database management systems. Randy holds a B.S. in Computer Information Systems from DeVry Institute of Technology and an M.B.A. from Illinois State University.

**Kenneth Wagers** is the Vice President of Client Information Services based in Kelmar's Colorado office. Mr. Wagers holds a Master of Taxation from the University of Denver, and a Bachelor of Arts in Finance and Accounting from the College of Idaho.
