

State Auditors Community – Cont.

- What Are We Working on
 - The State Auditors Community serves as a meeting space for State auditors/compliance employees to meet and discuss VDAs, third party audit programs, specific ongoing audits, trends in litigation impacting audits, etc.
 - The Stall Tactic subcommittee is working on a document that gives states background on and suggestions on how to react to legal arguments sent by holders and holder advocates to the States. The arguments serve to attempt to cancel or stall an audit.
 - The Third Party Auditor review is creating an audit program to serve as a sort of peer review process to ensure that audit vendors are conducting audits in accordance with contracts with the State and that State's laws.

State Auditors Community – Cont.

- What's Next (Strategic Plan goals)
 - The audit community doesn't have specifically designated goals from the strategic plan.
 - However, the audit community seeks to inform one another of issues that impact States' ability to enforce their laws and ensure compliance with their laws.
 - The subcommittees are working to get through existing projects and continue to collect information that would impact those projects (such as newly arising stall tactics, litigation that would render the work moot, etc.)

 Developed draft legislation and rule making language

§ ___ Unclaimed cryptocurrency

- (a) The treasurer shall, in accordance with ______, adopt such regulations as are necessary for the for the method of delivery, transfer, maintenance, and sale of cryptocurrency that is presumed abandoned.
- (b) The treasurer may decline to accept cryptocurrency deemed abandoned if the treasurer, in his or her discretion, determines that the cryptocurrency is not freely transferable, is of nominal value, or the value is less than the estimated expenses of maintenance, notice, or sale of the property.
- (c) The treasurer may, in his or her discretion, direct a holder of cryptocurrency to sell cryptocurrency in conjunction with its reporting. A holder that sells cryptocurrency at the direction of the treasurer shall be entitled to the protections provided under ______, provided that the holder has complied with the notice provisions of _____ and has otherwise acted in good faith.
